**YCAC Receives Spring Hill Funding**

Yates County Arts Center is pleased to announce that we are the recipient of a grant from the Spring Hill Fund, a component fund of Rochester Area Community Foundation. In coordination with LEAH (Learning and Education at Home), CFRC (Child and Family Resource Center) and Keuka Lake School (servicing special needs pre-schoolers), YCAC has identified two specific areas of community need for arts programming. The two targeted underserved populations are: pre-schoolers (ages 2-5) and home schooled students comprising almost 6% of the Yates County school aged children.

The funding will provide 33 weeks of arts programming for the school year, October 2007 through June 2008. The following classes will be held for home schooled students in the YCAC Upstairs Workshop space : Simply Printmaking, Adventures in Art, Kids' Color, Soapstone Carving, Painting for Kids, and Theater Workshop. The Preschool classes will be held at both the Child and Family Resource Center and Keuka Lake School and will include: Adventures in Clay, Adventures in 3-Dimensional Art, Adventures in Printmaking and Adventures in Theater Arts.

Classes will be taught by professionally qualified artists and teachers who have experience teaching children and strive for creating an encouraging atmosphere for creativity and learning. Parents will also be encouraged to become involved in this program. Each final class session will provide an opportunity for parents to see what has been learned in their child's ongoing art education and to observe, appreciate, and encourage each child's endeavors.

The Spring Hill Fund specifically targets Yates County for its applicants and is financed by an anonymous donor. We are excited about the new programs that we are able to offer to two under-served populations of our rural community: home schooled children and pre-schoolers. YCAC wishes to express our sincere thanks to the Spring Hill Fund of the Rochester Area Community Foundation for their generosity and support of our mission to enhance and enrich life in rural Yates County through education in and advancement of the arts.

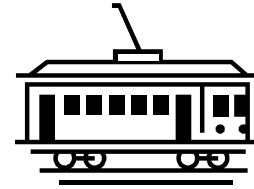

## Holiday Show “Celebration” Introduces Lynne Feldman’s Art

Lynne Feldman has a saying on the door to her studio: *“Painting is easy. All you have to do is stare at a blank canvas until drops of blood appear on your forehead”*. She says, “When I stare at a blank canvas I have one of several emotions. One is excitement for I am looking at a perfectly blank canvas that holds infinite possibilities and I can’t wait to begin. Another is fear because I am looking at a perfectly blank canvas that holds infinite possibilities and I have no idea of what I want to do.” Many painters can identify with that.

Ms Feldman grew up on Manhattan’s Upper West Side. She began her formal art training at the age of 12 at the Art Students League of New York, and continued to study drawing and painting there for the next 15 years. Ms. Feldman attended New York University and has a Master’s degree in Art Education from Columbia University. Her works have been exhibited in galleries, public spaces and museums around the country. Ms Feldman divides her time between Rochester and Montour Falls, New York where she lives with her husband Anthony Suchman.

She tell us: I have been a painter in oils for the past 40 years. I discovered Serigraphy (silk screen printing) in 1990. I do all of my own color separations so, for me, this is a very “painterly” form of printing. My newest serigraph, **Animals At The Water**, has 15 colors on it. This means that I had to make 15 separate silk screen and layer all the colors one on top of the other in order to print it. This is a very labor intensive process but a very rewarding one. Another medium that I love is collage. I love searching every where I go for fabrics, beads, interesting seedpods, feathers, weathered pieces of metal to put into my works. I am always looking and I find a lot of pleasure in the hunt.

Lynne Feldman will make her YCAC debut in the holiday show, “Celebration”, which will open Sunday afternoon, November 18th, from 1:00—3:00. (NOTE NEW TIME.) Artists will drop off their works on Monday, Nov. 12, 10 AM—3 PM, for the “hanging”. The show will continue through December 22 for holiday shopping and enjoyment.

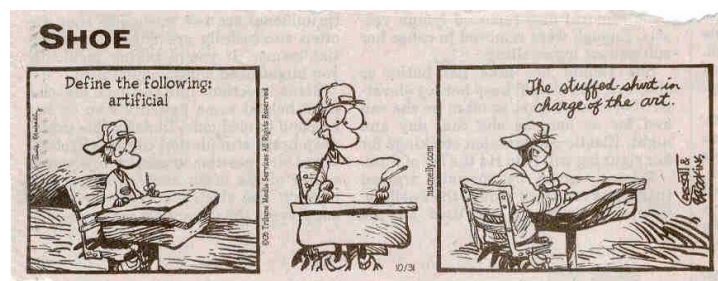

## Red Jacket Writers' Group

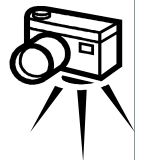
