## Photography Focus: "LIFESCAPES"

In October, the new exhibition "LifeScapes" will begin with a reception on Friday the 12<sup>th</sup> (admission free) from 5 to 7 PM. Complementary wine tasting will be provided by Serenity Vineyards (http://serenityvineyardsofny.com). The show will be an illustration of the infinite creative potential offered by landscapes. Along with the ACYC Members Artists we will feature the work of three remarkably talented photographers, each of them with a different approach of the subject: Gil Maker, Sheridan Vincent and JFK/AJVK.

Gill Maker will present a body of work which illustrates the "travel photography" category at its best. When we met, Maker said: "My images are seen through my mind, then the camera, finally the processing renders the final image. Shapes or forms are never manipulated on the computer. The hues, luminance and saturation of the colors sometimes are. Through this process I bring out the finished image the way my mind pictured it just before I pushed the shutter". He is proposing to share with you his vision of the landscapes of Iceland. More information on his site:


Sheridan Vincent's statement "Photography for me is an opportunity to look closer at what is often common and routine. I seek common, interesting and photogenic moments in the Rochester and the Finger Lakes region" clearly describe the originality of his work. His pictures, very often panoramic scenes, have usually a water element. He has mastered the art of making large photographs and uses different print materials (special papers, canvas or white coated aluminum) to produce images at their best. JFK/AJVK, John Kosboth is pushing landscape photography to its upper limits. Generally starting with a landscape and using creativity and emotion, his images are artifacts of a personal process. He describes his images as "clean, emotionally laden images of intent and intensity". They are the result of lengthy hours of processing (his philosophy is "the image is never done") and they tell strong stories or illustrate his inner thoughts.

You are invited to come and enjoy the work of these three gifted photographers with very different approaches of landscapes.

The show at the new gallery on Main street Penn Yan is open to all and wheel chair accessible. It will run from October 12 until November 12, 2012.





#### Romero Britto Sculpture Sale to Benefit Arts Center

Brazilian-American Neo-pop artist Romero Britto's vibrant, joyful work is instantly recognizable throughout the world. His paintings and sculptures, which combine elements of cubism, American pop art and graffiti, have been commissioned by such renowned corporations as Disney, Pepsi, Absolut Vodka, BMW and Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines.

A resident of Miami, Florida, Britto often vacations on Keuka Lake and was one of the Arts Council's featured artists in 2002.

Britto has donated to the Arts Center a very collectable, limited edition, mixed media enameled sculpture, designed as a prototype for a fifteen foot installation at the Miami Children's Museum. The piece (number 100 of an edition of 500), titled Children of the World, will be sold through a silent auction this fall.

## Humanitarian Appeal Wheeler Poet and Publisher Michael Czarnecki Lost All in Fire

Poet Michael Czarnecki, whose Memoir-Writing workshop at the Arts Center some years ago gave birth to a long-term group of writers, has sustained a monumental loss.

While on the first days of their first vacation in decades, Michael and his wife received a call from their son with the news that everything they owned, house, publishing business, years of journals, had evaporated. Their off-the-grid home in Wheeler, raised by Amish neighbors some years ago, had burned to the ground.

There has been a heart-warming response by his many friends and fellow writers to raise money so the Czarneckis can have a house raised, again by the Amish neighbors, by winter. A modest budget of \$22,700 must be raised for materials.

The project title is "Raise the roof for the Czarnecki family". A video on the site will introduce you to them. (This is the same site where funds were so successfully raised for the Rochester school bus monitor who was bullied by students.)

A second opportunity to contribute is an event at 171 Cedar Street in Corning, Saturday, September 8, 7-10 PM. This will include an evening of poetry readings, musical performances, and silent auction of artwork.

Finally, Michael will be doing an "Oral Memoir" reading event at our gallery on Thursday, October 11, at 7 PM, and conduct a "Palm of the Hand" Memoir Writing Workshop on Saturday, October 13, from 9-12.

#### Don Sottile Creates Public Art for Penfield

Don Sottile, artist and long-time friend of ACYC, was commissioned to create Penfield's newest art:

The Town of Penfield dedicated the statue of its founder, Daniel Penfield, installed in Schaufelberger Park in the historic Four Corners on Thursday, July 12.

The town's Bicentennial Committee commissioned sculptor Don Sottile to create the larger-than-life bronze sculpture as part of Penfield's bicentennial celebration in 2010. Sottile is a well-regarded regional artist known for his public works including two famous sculptures of Abraham Lincoln.

The installation features Daniel Penfield standing alongside a granite millstone as a symbol of the milling industry and settlement he fostered along the waterfalls of Irondequoit Creek. The burgeoning community was established as the Town of Penfield in 1810.

The performance covers the time period from John Kennedy's assination in 1963, when he was in eighth grade, through 1975, when he bacame part of a rural community in the hills of NYS. Along the way he suffered through battles of conscience, incurred the wrath of the family, participated in college demonstrations, hitchhiked 30,000 miles, backpacked in the mountains, and experienced the usual late-teen, young adult joys and sorrows of life. All of this is set against the cultural and historical happenings of the era as it affected him.

This is not a memoir of one who was a major, or even a minor, figure of the time. No San Francisco, Woodstock, group sex or heavy drug experiences. Just the story of an ordinary person who happened to come of age during this unique time period in our recent history.

Those who lived through the 60's will find much to connect with. Others who know of it as "history" will get an understanding of one person's experience during those vital and vibrant years.

Solar printmaking (intaglio) is a highly versatile and expressive medium, transforming original drawings, paintings, collage, vintage and/or contemporary photographs, JPEG'S, and copier art into high quality etchings. Create a plate using UV light (the sun) without losing your image. Make a small edition. and clean up without the use of turps. You will not use any acids. Enjoy making plates in the sun, developing them with ordinary tap water, and printing the images with an intaglio press.

The focus will be upon utilizing the tools of the print-maker, your potential and creativity as an artist, the simplicity of plate processing, and the production of professional artwork. You will be introduced to a variety of techniques; printmaking practices, and participate in critiques.

Explore the unique sensitivity of Solar printmaking, using an Intaglio Press to create limited edition etchings. Solar printmaking will appeal to artists of all levels, from students and beginners to experienced printmakers, photographers, painters, and artists of all media.




The Yates County Photography Club will meet at 7:00 P.M., September 20th at the Yates County Arts Center, 127 Main Street, Penn Yan, N.Y.
