Artists' Announcements, FAQ

FAQ: How does an artist get to exhibit at The Yates Gallery? A committee reviews 3 typical pieces of art brought in by a potential artist. All media are welcome. Entry is based on quality of the work, proximity of the artist (or local connection), and whether the gallery can support one more artist in that particular medium.

What commission does the gallery take? 35%

Standards? Work to be hung must have a wire, not a toothed bar. Matted works are preferred to be in white or neutral mats. Small items (jewelry, cards, etc.) are preferred to come with their own display racks.

Are artists required to volunteer hours? No, but it is much appreciated. Many volunteer jobs exist, so something will fit anyone's schedule. It's only fair, right?

“Summer Life” Exhibition Opening August 6

“Summer Life” Exhibition opens with a reception on Friday, August 6 from 5:00-7:00 pm. The exhibition will be on view until September 11th at Yates Gallery in Penn Yan featuring the work of painter **Deanne Belinoff** and sculptor **Jacqueline Lorieo**. Work of YCAC’s exhibiting artists will also be on view and feature works around the “summer life” theme. The reception is free and open to the public with wine tasting, punch, and appetizers. Wine is being generously donated by Rooster Hill Vineyards.

Jacqueline Lorieo resides “down-state” but spends time during the summer on Keuka Lake. In addition to sculpture, Lorieo works as an occupational therapist, and her medical background influences the forms and subjects of her art. She creates bronzes, large wooden torsos and small hand-held medals. She has exhibited in numerous shows in the United States and abroad, and her work is in public and private collections. A board member of the Sheldrake Environmental Center, she designed the bronze plaques that are situated along the trails of the Larchmont, NY property and may be used for rubbings.

She says, “My medical background influences the form and themes of my art. The work is beautiful, feminine, nurturing and powerful. I have incorporated the universal themes of humanity and science into the bronzes, my large wooden torsos, and small handheld medals. I feel each piece provides a small window to my soul for the viewer.”

Visual artist **Deanne Belinoff** will exhibit some recent works along with her floral series at the “Summer Life” Exhibition.

Describing her work Belinoff states, “Working in the long tradition of geometric abstraction that is grounded in nature and pays homage to reductivism, I draw my inspiration from scientific and metaphysical concepts about the natural world. In most of my drawings and paintings of the last two decades I have used geometric shapes--primarily the circle--as a means of expressing my ideas about reality and its underpinnings, the vast rotations of solar systems, and the implicit connection of all things in the universe.”

Belinoff has taught art extensively and participated in numerous solo and public exhibitions throughout the United States.

Deanne has received several artist fellowships and been a resident of artists communities. YCAC is pleased to have her participate in the Artist-in-Residence program at their Sunny Point facility on East Lake Road in Dundee during the first two weeks in August this year. Not only will Belinoff be exhibiting her paintings at the Yates Gallery, but she will also be teaching two adult art workshops during the first week in August and a children’s workshop the second week in August at Sunny Point. 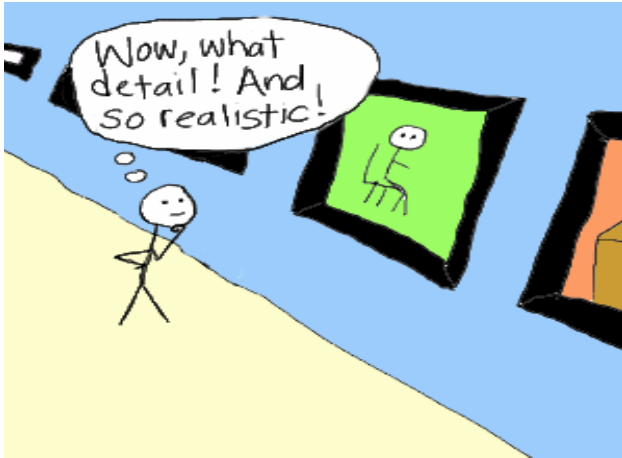
